COORDINATOR, TRANSPORTATION ENGINEERING

An immediate opportunity exists for an experienced individual to develop and implement policies, procedures and ordinance for adoption on transportation related issues. You will plan and review detailed traffic impact studies of major developments and provide input on master transportation plans and the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process. Your reports will detail various conclusions, recommendations and initiatives to optimize vehicular and pedestrian traffic safety and efficiency.

You will possess a minimum of three years progressively more responsible professional traffic engineering experience, preferably in a municipal environment, supplemented by a University Degree in Transportation Engineering, Civil Engineering, or a related field. Specialized graduate traffic courses or a Master's Degree in Traffic/Transportation Engineering is an asset. You will also possess, or be eligible for membership with PEO as a Professional Engineer in the province of Ontario. You will have advanced knowledge of computer based traffic analysis techniques, traffic study methodology, drafting functions and street light standards. You will be required to independently evaluate, select, and apply transportation planning and engineering techniques, procedures and criteria. A strong understanding of traffic by-laws, standards and regulations, the *Highway Traffic Act*, Traffic Engineering Manuals and the application of traffic control devices and relevant safety legislation is important to this function.

You will have strong communication (oral and written in English), organizational, analytical, problem solving and customer service skills. Your ability to establish and maintain effective work relationships with contractors, consultants, municipal employees and members of Council is required.

You must have a personal vehicle and a valid class "G" Ontario driver's license and be willing to provide a driver's abstract and satisfactory criminal reference check as a condition of employment. Occasional evening and weekend work may be required.

Remuneration includes a comprehensive benefits package, pension plan and a base annual salary range of \$57,239 - \$63,591 (based on a 35 hour work week).
