DUTIES:

- Perform labour duties in the development, manufacture, construction, placement and maintenance of all traffic and parking control devices.
- Comply with all applicable Federal, Provincial and Municipal regulations, policies and procedures, including the Occupational Health & Safety Act.
- Remove obstacles hazardous to employees or the public that interfere with the safe operations of vehicles or equipment.
- Immediately report vandalism, mechanical, electrical, and telecommunication difficulties and damage.
- Complete daily activity time sheets
- Report on variances in daily work plans
- Perform other related duties as assigned

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Grade 12 diploma and must be a licensed electrician TQA (Trades and Qualifications Act) specializing in construction and maintenance
- Considerable experience related to the duties listed above, normally acquired through 4 years experience working as a licensed electrician in a similar environment. Candidates with an equivalent combination of education and experience may be considered.
- Must hold a valid class “D” drivers licence with a “Z” endorsement and possess a good driving record.
- Must achieve IMSA Traffic Signals Level One certification within two years of hire
- Knowledge of the Ontario Traffic Manual would be an asset
- Must be able to physically perform strenuous and repetitive work in a safe manner including but not limited to climbing, lifting, bending, pushing, pulling and moving heavy items in all types of weather conditions.
- Possess basic computer skills
- Must be a reliable self-starter, able to perform a variety of tasks and work with or without supervision
- Must be able to communicate with customers in a cordial manner
- Knowledge of computerized traffic signal system components an asset
- Knowledge of the Occupational Health and Safety Act.
